OneNewsPage.com breaks 3 million headlines barrier and introduces new navigation and features

International news headline portal www.onenewspage.com, launched only in May 2009, has today carried more than three million story headlines on its site. It has also introduced some attractive new features and substantially improved the site's navigation.

One News Page features a fully searchable news archive. Around 20,000 new headlines are added each day to its database, sourced from over 1,200 categorised feeds from quality global news sources. All kinds of news topics are covered by the site, including current affairs, business and finance, politics, sports, lifestyle, science and technology.

The key word search facility, now relocated to the top left-hand side of every page, allows users to find stories and to see automatically other stories written on the same theme or topic.

Today, One News Page has also launched a new 'Celebrities' news category. Users can click on headlines from the major specialist celebrity magazines and websites, such as Hello, OK!, Heat, TMZ, Grazia and Closer, to name but a few.

The addition of the Celebrities section was just a small part of the major site redesign. In a single click, using the new navigation, users can now directly access all news categories from any section of the One News Page portal website.

Another new feature on the site is thumbnail images of the newspaper or magazine carrying the story. By clicking on the headline, users can see how the story is displayed in its original context. If they want to read the story in full, they can click on the image straight through to it.

One News Page has also been syndicated as an 'add on' by Mozilla for its popular Firefox browser. To add a news search engine to the Firefox browser, simply click on <https://addons.mozilla.org/en-US/firefox/addon/11154>.
